The portal enables suppliers to view and respond to messages generated by BBDC's SAP system or third-party logistics provider (3PL) and is fully double byte-enabled for Chinese language use. In addition, an integrated barcode generator produces AIAG B10 compliant barcode-readable labels to enable automated goods receipt at BBDC's warehouse.

"Although the number of Chinese manufacturers utilizing B2B applications is still limited, the application of IT informatization systems has been gradually improving, and B2B integration applications will become a major player in dealing with business operations," said E-WORKS CEO Dr Huang Pei in granting SEEBURGER's Outstanding Supplier award at the Chinese Manufacturing CIO Forum. "SEEBURGER's B2B integration solution is unique because it accommodates all industrial and regional-specific data standards and communication

protocols, provides a single easy-to-maintain solution that uniquely spans the entire supply chain, and is fully customized and targeted for the needs of the Chinese market.”
